## A ShelterBox Nativity?

What inspiration – or foolishness – resulted in Hadleigh URC deciding to put up a ShelterBox Nativity scene and invite everyone to come and see it?

It wasn't simply the obvious parallels -  
a homeless family given shelter in a stable in Bethlehem  
and homeless families given shelter in tents,

or

new born baby Jesus laid in a manger  
and new born babies put to bed in a ShelterBox.

Nor was it just for the fun of trying to work out other links between the Christmas story and the disaster relief work of ShelterBox, though that was certainly enjoyable!

It was really to emphasise that Christmas is not just a lovely story from the past, which you can choose to believe or not.

It is to try to let people know that Christmas is God's plan for a world where people really love one another. God himself came as a baby to show us and teach us how to love one another. During Jesus' brief ministry he touched and healed the lives of many people. But this is not just a story of 2000 years ago. Jesus is alive and by his Spirit and through us he still brings healing.

ShelterBox is one way of bringing hope and healing into the world. It is one way of expressing God's love and Jesus' presence where there is great fear and loss. We want people to see that God is still working in his world.

But how will they see, unless you show them? How will they know the ShelterBox Nativity is here, unless you tell them? Will they come to see, unless you invite them? Invitations giving details of when the ShelterBox Nativity can be seen are available in the Vestibule. Encourage friends, family and neighbours to come and see God at work in his world.

Invite those you know to come to our special Christmas services, which will feature the ShelterBox Nativity. Help them to see that our God of love is still active in his world.

## **Advent and Christmas Services**

Please pray for our Advent and Christmas Services. Throughout Advent we will be linking our Advent theme with the ShelterBox Nativity. Ask God who you might invite so that they can hear of God's love for them.

### **10.30am Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> December – Nativity & Gift Service**

A service for all ages, where the younger children will be retelling the story of the birth of Jesus and we will sing some well known Christmas carols. We will think of the work of ShelterBox and would encourage gifts of money towards their work. We would also invite gifts of toys and toiletries for local causes.

### **3.00pm Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> December – Carol Service (Monks Eleigh)**

Choose your favourite carols and share in the Christmas readings.

### **6.30pm Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> December – Carols by Candlelight**

In a beautiful candle-lit setting, we will retell the Christmas story through traditional and modern carols, Bible readings and a drama. We will link in with the work of ShelterBox. The service is followed by mince pies and refreshments.

### **11.30pm Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> December – Carols at Midnight**

We are invited to join with our friends at St Mary's to worship and wait for the arrival of the Christ Child.

### **10.30am Christmas Day, Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> Dec.**

A short celebration service (finished by about 11.15am) for all ages, when we rejoice in the good news of God's love in Jesus. Come and celebrate together as God's family.

### **10.30am Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> Jan. – Carol Praise**

Come and choose carols we haven't yet sung, or you'd like to sing again. Bring a favourite Christmas reading, poem, prayer or story that we can all enjoy. As the church family, let's share together in praise for the God who chose to come and live among us.

### **Church Meeting Monday 5<sup>th</sup> Dec. 7.30pm Community Room**

## Disney's *A Christmas Carol*



The Ansell centre is presenting Dickens's *A Christmas Carol* for our December film on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> December.

Despite the title, the Disney version is a faithful adaptation of the Charles Dickens story which is almost a part of Christmas as Santa Claus !

In the film Jim Carrey appears in a multitude of roles, including Ebenezer Scrooge as a young, middle-aged, and old man , together with the three ghosts who haunt Scrooge !

The Disney film , with music , has developed a technique that transforms live actors into semi-animated figures, taking Dickens's cautionary tale into a visually arresting, but at times scary film. It is not considered suitable for a very young audience, as it was awarded a PG certificate.

Whilst Jim Carrey's 8 roles in the film could be considered a tour de force, he is well supported by actors Bob Hoskins , Colin Firth, Steve Valentine, and Michael Fox amongst others.

Your committee hope that you will enjoy this rather special Christmas presentation. To get you into the Christmas spirit, we will be serving festive refreshments!

As always, our presentation starts at 7.30pm; admission is £ 3 for adults, £ 2 for an accompanied child.

## **BIBLE A MONTH CLUB**

Bibles have become available in ten more languages during the last year - and New Testaments have been translated into 27 more languages.

The latest Bible Society translation report measures the progress made by them and other translation agencies over the past 12 months. The figures covering 2010, show that the complete Bible has now been translated into 469 languages and the New Testament into 1,231 languages. So many different languages and people who desire a Bible that they can read and find out about Jesus and what he did for us.
